

Location



- Africa and Asia
- The Middle East is a geographical and cultural region located primarily in western Asia, but also in parts of northern Africa and southeastern Europe. The western border of the Middle East is defined by the Mediterranean Sea, where Israel, Lebanon, and Syria rest opposite from Greece and Italy in Europe.
- Bordered by Asia to the east, Europe to the northwest, Africa to the southwest, and the Mediterranean Sea to the west.



Physical Characteristics

- Middle East has about 3.5 million square miles
- Climate
 - Primarily Steppe (Semi-Arid) & Desert (Arid)
- Sahara & Rub'al Khali Deserts
- Anatolia, Sinai, & Arabian Peninsulas
- Nile, Tigris, & Euphrates Rivers
- Hindu Kush, Zagros, Hejaz, Atlas Mountains
- Rich in natural resources such as oil

Human Characteristics

- Population of approx. 381 million people
- Languages: Arabic, Hebrew, Turkish, Persian (Farsi), Kurdish, Berber, and many other minor languages
- Religion: Primarily Islam (91.2% of population is Muslim, meaning 315 million people or about 23% of the world's Muslim population)





The Environment Impacts

- Water is scarce in most places, so people have to find ways to preserve it.
- Many natural resources such as oil.
- Deserts and mountains are natural barriers

Humans adapt

- People in the Middle East adapt to their environment by wearing lighter, looser clothes, and building light colored houses. They also base their diets on what is available in their region.
- They modify the environment by adding air conditioning to their homes to make them more comfortable. They also plant crops and trees to provide food and shade for themselves.
- The people of the Middle East depend on the rivers and occasional rain to make crops grow, and rejuvenate the land.
 - Aquifers, desalination, drip irrigation, dams
